WHAT IS SW&D?

Stiftung Wissenschaft und Demokratie (SW&D), the "Foundation Science and Democracy" was founded in 1992 by Prof. Dr. Eberhard Schütt-Wetschky with the aim of promoting practical political science as a non-profit foundation under civil law. The Foundation Science and Democracy supports academic projects which are suited to promote democracy and democratic values as enshrined in the Grundgesetz, the German Constitution. This applies primarily to political science and its related fields of research, but also to the so-called "policy sciences".

Together with its founder the Foundation Science and Democracy understands politicial science as a partner of democracy. We aim at supporting political science where it contributes to solutions of practical and normative problems of democracies.

Next to the IParl, also the Portal for Political Science (pw-portal) is an institution of the Foundation Science and Democracy. Furthermore, the Foundation publishes SIRIUS – Journal for Strategic Analysis and funds the Institute for Security Policy at Kiel University (ISPK).

The Institute for Parliamentary Research (IParl) is dedicated to theoretical and empirical investigations that focus on both the underlying principles and the details of democratic representation and legitimation. Special attention is placed on the close relation to political reality



WHO WE ARE

Promoting research on parliamentarism, bringing together theoretical reflections on democratic representation, studying parliaments with all adequate methods, having impacts on the political practice – these were the driving forces behind the efforts to establish the Institute for Parliamentary Research, IParl.

The founder of Stiftung Wissenschaft und Demokratie (SW&D), the "Foundation Science and Democracy" – Prof. Dr. Eberhard Schütt-Wetschky – and Prof. Dr. Suzanne S. Schüttemeyer had followed such goals in their academic lives, and this unison in interest materialised when the foundation wanted to engage in the study of parliamentarism. Thus, in 2016 Suzanne Schüttemeyer became founding director of the IParl as an institution of the SW&D and developed it as an independent research centre in Berlin.

Its main focuses of interest are parliament and parties in Germany and in other countries, subnational parliaments and second chambers. The methods used are comparative, quantitative and qualitative. Advancing theories of representation, democracy and parliamentarism is as much the aim as creating knowledge in close contact with, and useable for, political actors and institutions.
